1. crankshaft A shaft moved by a mechanical device consisting of an arm or handle that is connected to it.
2. turbine A machine in which a moving fluid such as steam acts upon the blades of a rotor to produce rotational motion that can be transformed to electrical or mechanical power.
3. generator A machine or device that is used to convert mechanical energy, for example, that provided by the combustion of fuel, into electricity.
4. kinetic energy Energy that a body or system has because of its motion.
5. potential energy The energy that a body or system has stored because of its position in an electric, magnetic, or gravitational field, or because of its configuration.
6. solar heater A device that captures the Sun's energy and transforms it into heat.
7. electromagnetic radiation Electromagnetic energy such as gamma rays, X-rays, ultraviolet light, visible light, infrared radiation, microwaves, and radio waves.
8. electromagnetic spectrum The complete range of electromagnetic radiation from the shortest waves (gamma rays) to the longest (radio waves).
9. radio wave An electromagnetic wave whose frequency falls within the radio spectrum, they are the longest waves in the electromagnetic spectrum. Used to broadcast radio and television programs.
10. microwave Radio waves used in radar and in some oven to cook food.
11. infrared radiation Another name for heat energy. Found above radio waves in the electromagnetic spectrum.
12. visible light The only part of the electromagnetic spectrum that human eyes can see. They are shorter than infrared waveD.
13. X-rays The second shortest waves of the energy in the electromagnetic spectrum. They pass through skin and muscle, but are absorbed by bone.
14. gamma rays The shortest waves of energy in the electromagnetic spectrum. They travel through almost any material.
15. provide To supply somebody with or be a source of something needed or wanted.
16. broadcast To transmit a program or information on television or radio.

17. dropper

Small glass or plastic tube with a rubber bulb at one end that is used to suck up liquid and release it one drop at a time.
