1. escort Escort, escorted, escorting. To accompany somebody or something as an escort.
2. swell Swell, swelled, swelling. To become larger or rounder in size, especially as a result of an accumulation of fluid.
3. rely Rely, relied, relying. To trust fully; have faith in.
4. worthy Fully deserving something, usually as a suitable reward for a merit or importance.
5. churn A machine for making butter by agitating milk or cream.
6. deserve To do something or show qualities worthy of (a reward or punishment as appropriate).
7. defend Defend, defended, defending. To resist an attack on; protect from harm.
8. disguise To alter in appearance or nature so as to conceal the identity of.
9. stagecoach A large closed horse-drawn vehicle formerly used to carry passengers and often mail along a regular route.
10. overturn To turn over and come to rest upside down.
11. clop A sound made by a horse's hooves on a hard surface.
12. thud A dull, heavy sound, such as that made by a large object falling to the ground.
13. patch A piece of material used to cover a torn or weak point.
14. reluctant Unwilling and hesitant; disinclined.
15. washtub A large metal tub for washing laundry.
16. shotgun A smoothbore gun for firing small pellets at short range.
17. hub The central part of a wheel or a similar rotating device such as a propeller.
18. stomp Stomp, stomped, stomping. To tread heavily and noisily, typically in order to show anger.
19. moan A long sound made by somebody expressing pain or misery.
20. grumbling Complaint in a bad-tempered way.
21. cap Cap, capped, capping. Put or form a lid or cover on.
22. rear The back or hindmost part of something.

23. weathered	Worn, damaged, or seasoned by exposure to the weather.
24. jib	To stop and refuse to move on (refers to animals).
25. jackrabbit	A hare found on the prairies and steppes of North America.
26. reward	Something desirable given in return for what somebody has done..
27. foster	1. To promote the development of something. 2. To provide a child with care and upbringing.
28. perform	To carry out, accomplish, or fulfill (an action, task, or function).
29. velvet	A cotton, silk, or nylon fabric with a dense soft pile and plain underside.
30. romp	To play about roughly and energetically.
31. retrieve	Retrieve, retrieved, retrieving. To get or bring back.
32. task	A piece of work that somebody is given to do.
33. heel	The back part of the foot below the ankle.
34. lid	A removable or hinged cover for the top of a container.
35. strip	To remove all coverings or clothes from.
36. deck	A floor of a ship, especially the upper, open level.
37. sniff	To draw air audibly through the nose.
38. tug	To pull hard or suddenly.
39. knob	A rounded projecting part attached to a door, drawer, or other object used as a handle.
40. pet	Pet, petted, petting. To stroke or pat (an animal).
41. pep	Liveliness or vigor.
42. scrapbook	A book of blank pages for sticking cuttings, drawings, or pictures in.
43. blind	Unable to see because of injury, disease, or a congenital condition.
44. forward	In the direction that one is facing or travelling.
45. delight	To give somebody great enjoyment and pleasure.
46. lap	Lap, lapped, lapping. To drink a liquid by scooping it into the mouth with the tongue (refers to animals).
47. vanish	Vanish, vanished, vanishing. To disappear suddenly and completely.

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| 48. haze      | Mist, cloud, or smoke suspended in the atmosphere and obscuring or obstructing the view.  |
| 49. crisp     | Firm, dry, and brittle, especially in a way considered pleasing.  |
| 50. fellow    | A man or boy (male).  |
| 51. tryout    | A test of the potential of someone or something, especially in sport.   |
| 52. flick     | Flick, flicked, flicking. To make or cause to make a sudden quick movement.   |
| 53. fleck     | A very small patch of color or light.   |
| 54. apologize | To express regret for something that one has done wrong.  |
| 55. dock      | To link a spacecraft with another in space, or be linked up in this way.  |
| 56. toss      | To throw lightly or casually.   |
| 57. interlock | To fit things together closely, especially by means of parts that mesh, hook, or be fitted together in this way.  |
| 58. squint    | Squint, squinted, squinting. To look at someone or something with partly closed eyes.   |
| 59. screw     | A short, slender, sharp-pointed metal pin with a raised helical thread running around it and a slotted head, used to join things together by being rotated in under pressure. |
| 60. wipe      | To clean or dry by rubbing with a cloth or one's hand.  |
| 61. plunge    | To fall or move suddenly and uncontrollably.  |

| 2. nonliving  | Things like rock, water, air, and soil.   |
| 3. consumers  | They are living things that use other living things for food.   |
| 4. herbivores | Animals that eat only plants.   |
| 5. carnivores | Animals that eat only other animals.  |
| 6. omnivores  | Consumers that eat both plants and animals.   |
| 7. food chain | Is how food energy moves through an ecosystem. Example, grass is eaten by a frog and the frog is eaten by a hawk. |
| 8. extinct    | An animal or plant is extinct when none of its kind are left on Earth.  |
