1. tissues	Groups of the same kind of cells joined together; a mass of cells.

3. organ system	A group of organs that work together in a certain job.
4. digestive system	The organs associated with the ingestion
5. Skeletal system	Includes the tissues such as bones, that provide support.
6. muscular system	Made up of the muscles. Together with the skeletal system, it makes movement possible.

7. nervous system      The brain, spinal cord and nerves. It makes an animal aware of what goes on around it and allows it to act on information from its surroundings.
8. respiratory system      The trachea, lungs and diaphragm.
9. excretory system      It carries wastes out of the body.
10. circulatory system      The channels through which the blood circulates.
11. marrow      The soft center part of a bone that produces red blood cells.
12. DNA      The molecule in the chromosomes that makes up the genetic code.
13. bases      Four bases are special molecules that make up DNA.
14. gene      A piece of DNA that makes up one part of the genetic code in a cell.
15. zygote      The new cell that forms when a sperm and an egg join.
16. species      A group of living things of one kind.
17. crossing-over      A trading of genetic information that takes place between paired chromosomes during meiosis.
