1.	organelles	Cell's working parts with special jobs.
2.	cytoplasm	The jelly-like material containing a cell's working part.
3.	cell membrane	A tough, thin covering that holds a cell together. It also controls the movement of materials in and out of the cell.
4.	nucleus	It controls the cell's activities. It contains the codes that give the cell its characteristics.
5.	cell wall	A thick, stiff outer covering that protects and supports each plant cell. It provides a route for water and minerals to travel among plant cells.
6.	chloroplasts	Organelles found in cells in plant's leaves and stems. They contain chlorophyll.
7.	photosynthesis	Process in which plants use water, carbon dioxide, and sunlight to make food.
8.	chlorophyll	The green coloring matter of leaves and plants.

9.	vacuole	A cell storage center, containing a liquid that is mostly water with salts and sugars.
10.	starch	Plants change some of the sugar they produce into starch and store it in different plant parts, such as roots.
11.	respiration	The process in which cells use food to release energy.
12.	mitochondria	Small organelles that produce most of a cell's energy in a process called cell respiration.
13.	dissolved	Past tense dissolve. To make a solution of, as by mixing with a liquid.
14.	diffusion	Mixing together by spreading into one another.
15.	osmosis	The diffusion of water through a membrane, such as a cell's membrane.
16.	mitosis	The usuall method of cell division.
