1. whirl To move or cause to move rapidly round and round.
2. shred A strip of material that has been torn, cut, or scraped from something larger.
3. sting To prick somebody's skin and inject a small quantity of a poisonous substance causing a sharp pain.
4. bruise An injury appearing as an area of discoloured skin on the body, caused by a blow or impact rupturing underlying blood vessels.
5. dizzy Having a sensation of spinning around and losing one's balance.
6. puddle A shallow pool of water, e.g. one formed by rainwater in a hollow on a road.
7. slip Slip, slipped, slipping. Lose one's balance or footing and slide unintentionally for a short distance.
8. amid Surrounded by; in the middle of.
9. bug An insect with thickened forewings and mouthparts adapted for piercing and sucking.
10. limerick A humorous five-line poem with a rhyme scheme.
11. bored Weary and impatient because one is unoccupied or lacks interest in something.
12. reply Reply, replied, replying. Say or write something in response to something said or written.
13. beetle An insect of a large order distinguished by having forewings modified into hard wing cases that cover and protect the hindwings and abdomen.
14. migrate To move from one region or country to another.
15. plenty An adequate or more than adequate amount or quantity.
16. chilly Unpleasantly cold.
17. thunderous Relating to or resembling thunder.
18. locust A large, mainly tropical grasshopper which migrates in vast swarms and is very destructive to vegetation.
19. blade The flat cutting edge of a knife or other tool or weapon.
20. willful Intentional; done deliberately.

21. starve To suffer or die or cause to suffer or die from hunger.
22. swarm A large group of insects, especially bees or gnats, in flight.
23. plague A disease that spreads rapidly through a population, killing a great many people, or an outbreak of such a disease.
24. roost A place where birds regularly settle to rest at night, or where bats congregate to rest in the day.
25. mate A friend companion.
26. hatch A small opening in a floor, wall, or roof allowing access from one area to another, in particular that in the deck of a boat leading to the cabin or lower level.
27. newly Only just; recently.
28. shrimp A small free-swimming, typically marine edible crustacean with ten legs.
29. strain To force (a part of one's body or oneself) to make an unusually great effort.
30. pregnant (of a woman or female animal) having a child or young developing in the uterus.
31. female Relating or belonging to women or girls.
32. expectant Hoping or anticipating that something, especially something pleasant, is about to happen.
33. blubber The fat of sea mammals, especially whales and seals.
34. thrill Thrill, thrilled, thrilling. To feel intense excitement, or make somebody experience intense excitement.
35. cliff A steep or vertical rock face, especially at the edge of the sea.
36. journey A trip or expedition from one place to another.
37. calf A young bovine animal, especially a domestic cow or bull in its first year.
38. echolocation The location of objects by reflecting sound, in particular as used by animals such as dolphins and bats.
39. scattered Few in number and far apart in distance or time.
40. shiver Shiver, shivered, shivering. To shake slightly and uncontrollably as a result of being cold, frightened, or excited.

41. trudge Trudge, trudged, trudging. To walk slowly and with heavy steps, typically because of exhaustion or difficult conditions.
42. manage Manage, managed, managing. Be in charge of.
43. loaded Carrying or bearing a load.
44. currently At the present time.
45. pleasure A feeling of happiness, delight or satisfaction.
46. cabinet A cupboard with drawers or shelves for storing or displaying articles.
47. drop To fall or cause to fall vertically.
48. inheritance Money, property or a title that has been inherited, or is to be inherited.
49. goodwill Friendly disposition toward somebody or something.
50. seek To try to find a person, thing or place.
51. blizzard A severe snowstorm with high winds.

4. full moon A full moon looks round.
5. crescent moon Is thin and looks like an eyelash.
6. crater Landforms on the moon, holes in the ground.
7. inner planet The planets that are closest to the Sun. (Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars).
8. Mercury The closest planet to the Sun.
9. Venus The second planet from the Sun, it is Earth's closest neighbor of the planets.
10. Earth The third planet from the Sun.
11. Mars The fourth planet from the Sun.

12. Jupiter The fifth planet from the Sun, and the largest planet in the Solar System.
13. Saturn The sixth planet from the Sun, it has large rings made of ice.
14. Uranus The seventh planet from the Sun.
15. Neptune The giant planet that is farthest from the Sun.
16. Pluto The last known planet in the Solar System, it is the smallest planet.
17. Comets Icy objects that orbit the Sun in long paths shaped like ovals.
18. Asteroid belt A large number of asteroids travel in an asteroid belt between Mars and Jupiter.
19. Meteor A streak of light in the sky made when a small meteoroid enters the Earth's atmosphere and burns up.
20. meteorite The remains of a meteoroid that has reached the Earth from outer space.
