1. lying Not telling the truth.
2. loyal Showing firm and constant support or allegiance to a person or institution.
3. quiver To shake or tremble with a slight rapid motion.
4. twitch To make or cause to make a short, sudden jerking movement.
5. shift To move or change or cause to move or change from one position to another.
6. snap To break with a sharp cracking sound.
7. leather The processed hide of animals with the fur or feathers removed..
8. sniff To draw air audibly through the nose.
9. tummy A person's stomach or abdomen.
10. duty A moral or legal obligation.
11. outstretch To extend or hold out something.
12. whine Whine, whined, whining. To cry, moan or plead with a long high pitched sound.
13. plop To fall into water without making a large splash.
14. litter Rubbish left in public.
15. anxiously Experiencing worry, nervousness, or unease.
16. tease To make fun of somebody, either playfully or maliciously.
17. degree The relative extent, amount, intensity, or level of something, especially when compared with other things.
18. refuse To indicate unwillingness to do something.
19. avoid Avoid, avoided, avoiding. To keep away or refrain from.
20. lest In case (conjunction).
21. moisture Wetness, especially as droplets of condensed or absorbed liquid or in a vapor.
22. thigh The part of the human leg between the hip and the knee.

24. canned	Preserved in a sealed can.
25. stare	Stare, stared, staring. To look fixedly at someone or something with the eyes wide open.
26. distaste	Mild dislike or aversion.
27. yucky	Messy or disgusting.
28. squeamish	Easily nauseated or disgusted.
29. grasp	Grasp, grasped, grasping. To seize and hold firmly.
30. tug of war	A contest in which two teams pull at opposite ends of a rope until one drags the other over a central line.
31. speck	A tiny spot.
32. unscrew	Unscrew, unscrewed, unscrewing. To unfasten (a screw, lid, etc) by twisting.
33. stir	Stir, stirred, stirring. To move a liquid around with a spoon in order to mix it thoroughly.
34. cinnamon	An aromatic spice made from the dried and rolled bark of an Asian tree.
35. chitter	To make twittering or chirping sounds.
36. flush	To become red in the face or on the skin, or make somebody to become red.
37. whisper	Whisper, whispered, whispering. To speak very softly using one's breath rather than one's throat.
38. thaw	To melt, or making something melt.
39. stab	Stab, stabbed, stabbing. Thrust a knife or other pointed weapon into somebody or something.
40. skittish	Easily agitated or alarmed.
41. bleed	To lose blood from the body, through a wound or because of illness.
42. wicked	Very wrong or very bad.
43. gag	Gag, gagged, gagging. A piece of cloth put in or over a person's mouth to prevent him from speaking.
44. paprika	A powdered spice with a deep orange-red color and a mildly pungent flavor, made from certain varieties of sweet pepper.
