SCIENCE AND GEOGRAPHY

1. forest A large area of land covered in trees and other plants growing close together, or the trees growing on it.
2. deciduous Used to describe trees and shrubs that shed their leaves in the fall.
3. rain forest A thick evergreen tropical forest found in areas of heavy rainfall and containing trees with broad leaves that form a continuous canopy.
4. tropic A very hot area often combined with a high degree of humidity.
5. canopy The uppermost layer of vegetation in a forest, consisting of the tops of trees forming a kind of ceiling.
6. aquatic Related to, connected with, or dependent upon water.
7. marine Related to, found in, or living in the sea.
8. saltwater Water that contains a large amount of salt, found in oceans.
9. plankton A mass of tiny animals and plants floating in the sea or in lakes usually near the surface.
10. gill The organ that fish and some other aquatic animals use to breathe, consisting of a membrane through which oxygen passes.
11. windmill A building or device fitted with a set of revolving blades designed to harness the power of the wind, for example, to pump water or generate electricity.
12. sizzle To make the noise of food frying.
13. prairie A treeless grass-covered plain in the United States and Canada, especially in the Midwest and the West.
14. hatch To emerge from an egg.

15. elk	A large mammal of the deer family, with long legs and, in the male, large flat palmate antlers.
16. herd	A large number of wild animals of the same kind that live, feed, and travel as a group.
17. natural resources	A naturally occurring material such as coal or wood that can be exploited by people.
18. renewable resources	A natural resource that replaces itself unless overused, for example, animal or plant life.
19. nonrenewable resources	Not able to be sustained or renewed indefinitely, because supply is limited or regrowth impossible.
20. coal	A hard black or dark brown sedimentary rock formed by the decomposition of plant material, widely used as a fuel.
21. soil	The top layer of most of the earth's land surface, consisting of the unconsolidated products of rock erosion and organic decay, along with bacteria and fungi.
22. fertilizer	A substance usually added to or spread onto soil to increase its ability to support plant growth.
23. mining	The process or business of removing minerals from the earth.
24. erosion	The gradual wearing away of rock or soil caused, for example, by water, wind, or ice.
25. compost	A mixture of decayed plants and other organic matter used by gardeners for enriching soil.
26. windbreaks	Something such as a wall or hedge that breaks the force of the wind.
27. minerals	An inorganic solid substance that occurs naturally in rocks and in the ground.
28. ore	A mineral from which particular constituents, especially metals, can be profitably extracted.
