1. wilderness A mostly uninhabited area of land in its natural uncultivated state, sometimes deliberately preserved like this.
2. settler A person who establishes in an area, especially one with no or few previous inhabitants.
3. longhorn An animal of a breed of cattle with long horns.
4. surround To occupy the space all around something.
5. saddle A seat with a raised ridge at the front and the back, fastened on the back of a horse for riding.
6. brim The top edge of a container such as a cup or bowl.
7. legging A protective covering made of a strong material that is wrapped around the lower leg by laborers and players in some sports.
8. thicket A dense group of small trees or bushes.
9. steer A male of the cattle family, especially a young bull, that has been castrated and is kept for beef.
10. mishap An unfortunate accident or piece of bad luck.
11. rustle To make or move with a soft, muffled crackling sound like that caused by the movement of dry leaves.
12. lecture An educational talk to an audience, especially one of students in a university.
13. rein A strap, or each half of a strap, by which a horse is controlled by its rider or by the driver of a coach or cart is pulling.
14. beacon A lighthouse or signaling buoy that produces a flashing light to warn or guide ships.
15. surge To move in or like a wave, rising up and subsiding and sweeping forward or back.
16. balk To hesitate over something or be unwilling to do something, usually because of moral scruples or a natural aversion.
17. quake (especially of earth) shake or tremble.
18. fare The money payable for a journey on public transport.
19. broad Having a distance larger than usual from side to side, wide.
20. chomp To munch or chew noisily and vigorously.

21. bramble	To gather blackberries.
22. somehow	In some way.
23. puddle	A small pool of liquid, especially of rain water on the ground.
24. sop	Something offered as a concession or gesture to pacify somebody who is angry or discontented.
25. raft	A flat buoyant structure of timber or other materials fastened together, used as a boat or floating platform.
26. tip	1. To cover or decorate the end of something. 2. The pointed or rounded extremity of something slender or tapering.
27. plain	Clearly visible and not blocked or obscured.
28. sandbar	A long ridge of sand formed in a body of water by currents or tides.
29. stampede	A sudden panicked rush of a number of horses, cattle, etc.
30. flare	A sudden brief burst of flame or light.
31. tributary	A river or stream flowing into a larger river or lake.
32. despite	Without being affected by.
33. fulfill	To achieve or realize (something desired, promised, or predicted).
34. range	The area of variation between limits on a particular scale.
35. trek	A long difficult journey, especially one made on foot.
36. resume	To continue with something after a temporary halt.
37. edible	Fit to be eaten.
38. peak	To reach the highest point.
39. pelt	To hurl missiles at.
40. restless	Unable to rest as a result of anxiety or boredom.
41. exhilarate	To make very happy or animated.
