1. furry Covered with or resembling fur.
2. sunburn Inflammation of the skin caused by overexposure to the ultraviolet rays of the sun.
3. bulky Large and awkward to carry or move.
4. spare time Time not spent working or attending to other day-to-day responsibilities.
5. trick A cunning action or plan that is intended to cheat or deceive.
6. eager Strongly wanting to do or have something.
7. frosty Very cold with frost forming on surfaces.
8. buckle up To fasten the buckle on a belt designed to keep the wearer securely in a vehicle or an aircraft.
9. slide Slide, slid, sliding. To move along a smooth surface, especially downwards, while maintaining continuous contact with it.
10. flick To move with a quick sharp jerk.
11. switch A device for making and breaking an electrical connection.
12. struggle To make forceful efforts to get free.
13. overjoyed Extremely happy.
14. sledge A vehicle or runners for travelling over snow or ice, either pushed, pulled, or allowed to slide downhill.
15. tip Tip, tipped, tipping. To cover or decorate the end of something.
16. tilt To move into a sloping position.
17. axis An imaginary line about which a body rotates or with respect to which it possesses rotational symmetry.
18. scout A soldier or other person sent out ahead of a main force so as to gather information about the enemy's position, strength, or movements.
19. puzzle To confuse somebody by being difficult or impossible to understand.
20. glassy Of or resembling glass.
21. unaware Having no knowledge of a situation or fact.

22. link Link, linked, linking. To connect, join, or associate somebody or something with another.
23. swiftly In a quickly or promptly way.
24. sparkle To shine brightly with flashes of light.
25. deem Deem, deemed, deeming. To regard or consider in a specified way.
26. leading Most important or in first place.
27. dew Tiny drops of water that form on cool surfaces at night, when atmospheric vapour condenses.
28. crawl Crawl, crawled, crawling. To move forward on the hands and knees or by dragging the body close to the ground.
29. rot To decompose by the action of bacteria and fungi; decay.
30. smooth Having an even and regular surface; free from projections or indentations.
31. asleep In or into a state of sleep.
32. hover Hover, hovered, hovering. To remain in one place in the air.
33. shovel A tool resembling a spade with a broad blade and upturned sides, used for moving coal, earth, snow, etc.
34. stir Stir, stirred, stirring. Move an implement round and round in (a liquid or other substance) in order to mix it thoroughly.
35. paddle Paddle, paddled, paddling. To propel a canoe or small boat through water using a paddle.
36. whirlpool A quickly rotating mass of water in a river or sea into which objects may be drawn.
37. bob Bob, bobbed, bobbing. To bounce up and down quickly and repeatedly.
38. gasp To draw in breath with a sudden audible intake.
39. spit Spit, spot, spitting. To eject saliva forcibly from one's mouth.
40. mouthful A quantity of food or drink that fills or can be put in the mouth.
41. bitter Having a sharp, pungent taste or smell; not sweet.
42. lift Lift, lifted, lifting. To raise or be raised to a higher position or level.
43. unbearable Not able to be endured or tolerated.

44. rocket Rocket, rocketed, rocketing. To move very rapidly.
45. fever An abnormally high body temperature, usually accompanied by shivering, headache, and in severe instances, delirium.
46. grip Grip, gripped, gripping. To take and keep a firm hold of.
47. lean Lean, leaned, leaning. Be in or move into a sloping position.
48. whirl Whirl, whirled, whirling. To turn or spin very quickly, or make something do this.
49. shred Shred, shredded, shredding. Tear or cut into shreds.
50. sting A skin wound that may hurt, swell up, and itch.
51. bruise An injury appearing as an area of discolored skin on the body, caused by a blow or impact rupturing underlying blood vessels.
52. dizzy Having a sensation of spinning around and losing one's balance.
53. puddle A small pool of liquid, especially of rain water on the ground.
54. slip Slip, slipped, slipping. Lose one's balance or footing and slide unintentionally for a short distance.
55. amid Surrounded by things or people.
56. bug An insect of a large order having piercing and sucking mouthparts, including aphids, leafhoppers, cicadas, and many other insects.
57. limerick A humorous five-line poem with a rhyme scheme.
58. bored Weary and impatient because one is unoccupied or lacks interest in something.
59. reply Reply, replied, replying. Say or write something in response to something said or written.
60. beetle An insect of a large order distinguished by having forewings modified into hard wing cases that cover and protect the hind wings and abdomen.
